Task Force - Findings

- Data from the St. Albert Food Bank indicated that as of December 2019, there were roughly 167 homeless people in St. Albert.
- Review of literature and interviews with several agencies who work with youth indicate that a youth transitional home is the best course of action for homeless youth in St. Albert.
- Based on interviews with COSA youth counsellors, Outreach School, SACV social workers, St. Albert Public Library, and St. Albert RCMP, a number of youth in St. Albert are 'unstably connected' with their family and natural supports.
- Literature indicates that transitional housing with advocacy support is the best support for this 'typology' of homeless youth



Municipal Role Environmental Scan

Functions:

- Advocacy
- Coordination

- Housing Advisory Boards
- Capital resources
- Staff resources





Task Force - Recommendations

- The development of a business plan for the construction & operation of a St. Albert Youth Transitional Home, with the ongoing operation being the responsibility of an agency experienced in providing housing for the target population.
- That Administration create a new Social Housing position.
- That Council approve the Task Force to continue working as the St. Albert leader of coordinated partnerships and actions.
