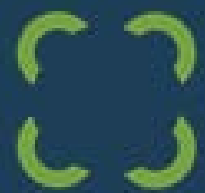

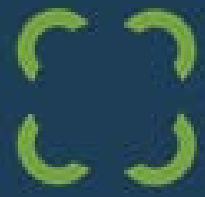

# Objectives of the Servicing Plan

1. To identify the services required to support the goals of and to implement the Growth Plan;
2. To support the optimization of shared services to enhance use of ratepayers dollars;
3. To facilitate orderly, economical and environmentally responsible growth in the Edmonton Metropolitan Region;
4. To coordinate planning and decisions regarding services among member municipalities to ensure the optimization of rate payer dollars



# Contents of the Servicing Plan

The **Servicing Plan** must

- a) List the servicing required to support the development outlined in the Growth Plan, which may include
  - i) transportation including regional transit
  - ii) water, waste water, and storm water
  - iii) solid waste
  - iv) emergency services, and
  - v) any other services identified by the Board which benefit residents in more than one of the municipalities that are part to the servicing plan
- b) For services provided on an intermunicipal basis; outline how it will be delivered and inter municipally funded
- c) Set the time frame for implementing services to be provided inter municipally
- d) Other matters necessary to support the Growth Plan

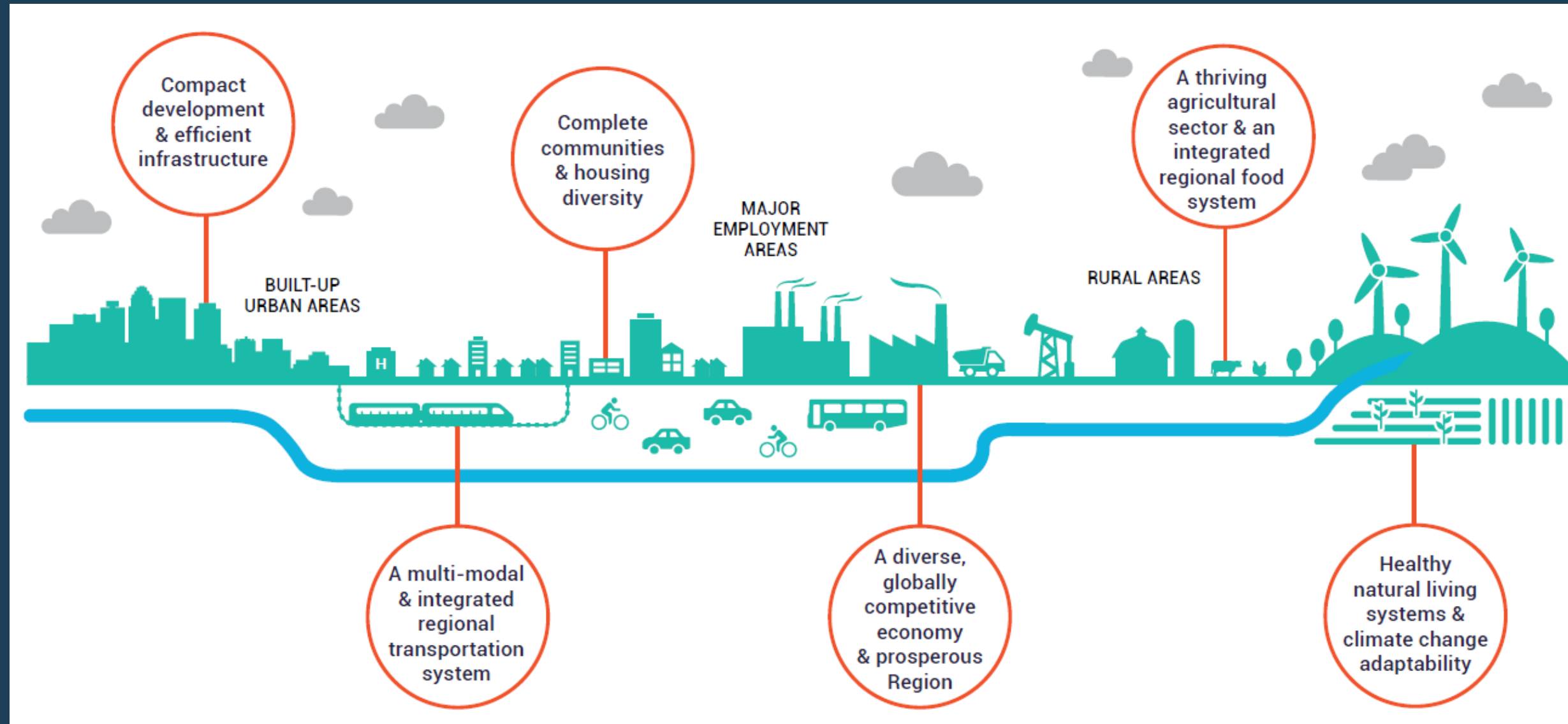
# MRSP Intent

- A framework and strategic guidance to optimize the planning and implementation of regional services

- Seeks to capitalize on regional opportunities and challenges for metropolitan services, now and in the future, for efficiency in planning through to service delivery
- The process enabled the identification of areas of regional significance to achieve greater efficiencies
- Establishes regional priorities across all service areas

# What the MRSP **is** ...

- **Regional strategy** for a Metropolitan Region Servicing Plan
- A **focused plan** on metropolitan services that are of **regional significance** and priority
- **Structured approach** and **process** for ongoing regional collaboration of metropolitan servicing
- MRSP Standing Committee to lead alignment of the MRSP with the Growth Plan
- **Four Regional Collaboratives** - Stormwater, Solid Waste, Fire/EMS and Emergency Management
- MRSP Principles to guide **information sharing, evidence-based decision-making, and prioritization of regional investments**
- A framework for **accountability and reporting** to the EMRB on the MRSP

# What the MRSP is not ...

- A plan for all metropolitan services
- Replacing many important and effective local and sub-regional plans or planning and service delivery entities
- A plan to define services nor service levels for the diverse rural and urban communities
- A plan that defines future local capital and operating plans for infrastructure investment
- A replacement for many important and effective initiatives by regional stakeholders and partners

# MRSP Principles

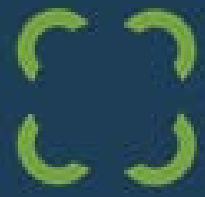
Achieving the desired future requires metropolitan servicing values and behaviors:

- **Lead with a metropolitan mindset for the greater good**
- Pursue leading and innovative research, technology, and best practices
- Build, collect, and share regionally relevant data, information and knowledge
- Prioritize regionally-scaled service investments informed by evidence
- Leverage sub-regional service initiatives to the benefit of the Region
- Recognize the unique urban and rural service contexts
- Factor in the safety and wellness of citizens
- Measure and report results from servicing efficiency and effectiveness
- Act in a regional manner with a unified voice



# MRSP Outcomes

- Harmonized data and information collection
- Sharing of regional evidence-based decision making for service planning, investment and delivery
- Pro-active regional planning for future growth, where appropriate
- Seamless and optimized service delivery ensuring appropriate service levels, where needed
- Efficient and cost-effective regional investments supported by all levels of government
- Globally recognized metropolitan servicing leveraging best practices and innovative service delivery technology and processes
- Effective engagement of stakeholders and communications to citizens
- Enhanced community safety, livability, sustainability and cost-effectiveness
- An investment-ready region for business growth and investment attraction
