

Regional Funding Models for Gymnastics Facilities

The following information has been provided by Dynamyx Gymnastics Club through the following document sources. Administration has not carried out a formal regional funding analysis and has not yet had an opportunity to vet the information.

Dynamyx Gymnastics Club – Phase 1 Report: Market Analysis Research

Gymnastics providers in the Edmonton region use a variety of arrangements in order to access needed space for programs. While the majority of clubs continue to rely on lease arrangements with private sector building owners, it is important to note that public sector support for gymnastics appears to be increasing and a number of successful facility partnerships have been formed in recent years. The following chart provides an overview of how clubs currently access program space.
