
St. Albert Policing Committee

Purpose & Objectives

- The Policing Committee serves to "strike a balance between police independence to conduct investigations and maintain order without undue political or other influence, with the need for accountability to the public."
- A Policing Committee also ensures for "efficient and effective policing and provides a local mechanism for receiving and monitoring public complaints against the police service."

Ultimately, a Policing Committee acts as an important liaison between City Council, the RCMP Detachment, and City residents to foster responsible community actions towards the creation of a safe and secure community. We also receive and share information with Municipal Policing to accomplish these objectives.

2018 Annual Report Highlights

- Worked collaboratively to provide input into the 2018-19 Annual Policing Priorities
- Received quarterly reports and updates from the RCMP Officer-in-Charge on progress towards accomplishing these Community Policing Priorities
- Attended the Annual Alberta Association of Police Governance Conference in Lacombe, Alberta
- Reviewed and made recommendations on City of St. Albert Policy C-PS-02 Policing Services

- Became organizational members of REACH Edmonton and the Alberta Hate Crimes Committee
- Participated in consultations held by the Solicitor General of Alberta on revisions to the Police Act
- Developed a "Communication and Public Participation Plan" to guide our community engagement activities
- Developed Policing Committee public engagement materials, which included popup banners, business cards, and name tags for committee members

- Revised and maintained a public Policing Committee webpage (www.stalbert.ca/spc), with agendas, minutes, reports, and contact information, which includes a dedicated phone number and email address
- Conducted a community policing priorities survey with Leger, which included
 - ► 12 2-hour Community Engagement Sessions hosted over 6 days
 - Survey Report informed development of 2019-20 APP

What is the Annual Policing Priorities Plan (APP)?

- A detailed work plan that is developed to focus the proactive efforts of the local RCMP.
- The plan is jointly produced by the Policing Committee and the Officer-in-Charge, based on identified community safety needs and concerns.
- Top 3 priorities have been identified along with several goals, initiatives, and measurables for each priority.

Objective: Reduce theft, theft from vehicles, break and enter, and drugs in the community

Community Policing

Objective: Work in partnership with St. Albert Policing Committee, social agencies, schools, and community to reduce crime and increase trust and confidence in policing

Objective: Enhance road and citizen safety
