#### **BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION**

This survey was intended to review the impacts that the COVID-19 pandemic may have had on the data from the Fall 2019 Community Satisfaction Survey and further asked residents about the level of impact that the pandemic has had on their households.

The presentation will enable Council to better interpret and understand the data and will also allow Council the opportunity to ask questions regarding the results.

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The two attachments highlight the results obtained from both the demographically represented City of St Albert General Population survey (green colouring) and the findings that were from the City of St Albert's Public Link to the survey (blue colouring).

#### STAKEHOLDER COMMUNICATIONS OR ENGAGEMENT

YStation conducted a demographically representative survey of over 400 residents to gauge the impacts of COVID-19 so that there was comparative data from our Community Satisfaction Survey from the fall of 2019.

Additionally, a public link was shared by the City of St Albert for the same survey where 119 residents responded.



# **Study Background**

Y Station conducted the 2020 Community Engagement Survey for the City of St. Albert. The objective of the survey is to provide the City of St. Albert with insights into the perceptions and opinions of residents across a number of subjects, including:

- Overall quality of life in the City of St. Albert;
- Property taxes and financial planning;
- Top priorities for the City of St. Albert; and
- The impacts of COVID-19 on households within the City of St. Albert.



Surveys were conducted from October 16 to 25<sup>th</sup>, 2020:

### **General Population Survey (n=424)**

Telephone interviews and web-based surveys through targeted social media ads were conducted, with established age and gender quotas to ensure proper demographic representation of the City of St. Albert. Identical to previous survey years, for the analysis, the data was weighted by gender and age, as per the City of St. Albert's most recent census.

The general population survey results alone give a margin of error no greater than ±4.7% at the 95% confidence level (or 19 times out of 20).



### **Overall Quality of Life**


How would you rate the overall quality of life in St. Albert?










Thinking about the amount of your tax bill that pays for City services, would you say you receive...?



Which tax strategy would you support the most for the City of St. Albert over the next 5 years?







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




### **Overall Quality of Life**

How would you rate the overall quality of life in St. Albert?






Which tax strategy would you support the most for the City of St. Albert over the next 5 years?


