The CSAC has recommended funding for the 2021 Community Capital Program Grant applicants received in the spring intake as follows:

## Application #1 - Kinsmen Club of St. Albert

- Project: Renovations / Improvements to the Kinsmen Banquet Centre and RV Park Upgrades
- Funding Request: \$41,250
- CSAC Recommended Funding: \$41,250
- The Kinsmen Club is requesting funding to offset costs from security system and safety upgrades at the Banquet Centre, and upgrades to the RV park including a storage shed, new RV park office and site upgrades to approximately 20 stalls. The RV Park is a very popular location for camping enthusiasts, and the improvements will be a welcome addition. Total project budget is \$125,001.

## **Application #2 – Muriel Martin Fundraising Society**

- Project: Replacement of Play Structure Component
- Funding Request: \$2,661
- CSAC Recommended Funding: \$2,661
- The school parent association is requesting funds to assist with the replacement of a piece of the school playground equipment (a spiderweb) which has become hazardous and must be removed. The base of the structure is solid, but the "web" must be repaired, or the entire structure will need to be removed. This component has been well used in the past and it is the desire of the parent committee to replace rather then remove the component completely. Total project budget is \$7,984.

## Application #3 - St. Albert Soccer Association

- Project: Upgrades to Riel Field 1
- Funding Request: \$27,847
- CSAC Recommended Funding: \$27,847
- The Soccer Association is requesting funding support to upgrade the infrastructure of Riel Field 1 to accommodate league requirements for their newly awarded Proam womens soccer franchise. The project includes bleachers, a scoreboard, as well as top dressing and additional seeding for the playing surface. Total project budget is \$83,541.
