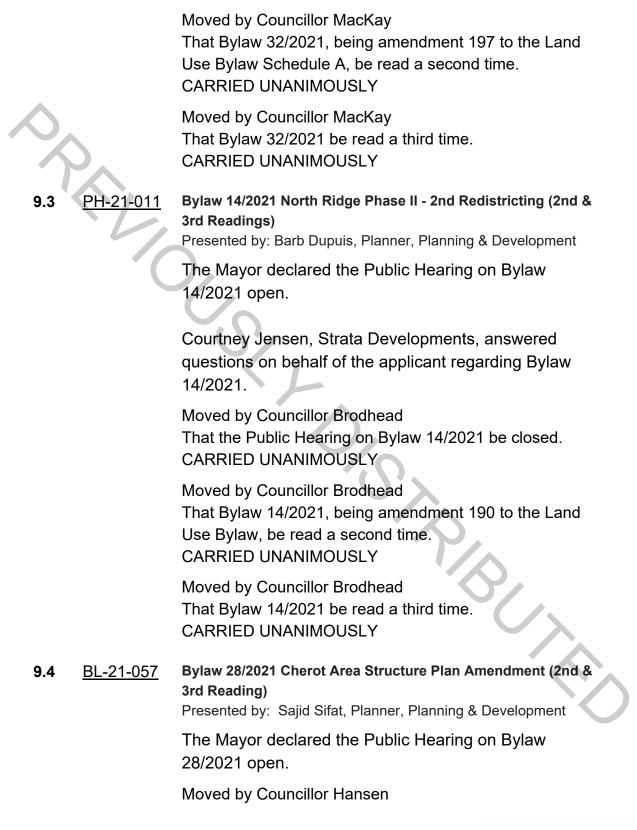

<u>Councillor Brodhead - Information Request</u> How many tickets for off-leash dogs in on-leash areas have been issues in since January 2019 to June 30, 2021.

If compliance with the Bylaw is the ultimate goal and "warnings" are issued to owners not in compliance with the Bylaw - what is the process for tracking these warning to ensure offending owners do not receive multiple warnings and never actually face the consequence of their unlawful activity. What is the fine for a dog biting a citizen? Is there an escalation in the fine, if any, if the bite is by an off-leash dog in an on-leash area? How many dog related bite complaints has the City received since January 2019 to June 30, 2021? How many of these bite complaints occurred in on-leash areas?

Do other communities have an escalation component to their animal bylaws fines for dog bites that occur in



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on-leash areas by off-leash dogs?
