TITLE: 2016 St. Albert Census Municipal Census Report

BACKGROUND:

Administration is providing the attached document entitled “2016 St. Albert Census Municipal Census Report” for information at this time.

Quick Facts from this report include:

- Population increased 2.20% from 63,255 in 2014 to 64,645 in 2016 (p. 3)
- Number of occupied dwellings increased from 23,168 to 24,055 (p. 13)
- Continued increase in the Seniors (65+) section of population (p. 7)
- Largest increases in population were in the neighbourhood's of North Ridge (791 people) and Erin Ridge North (785 people) (p.3)
- 50% of working St. Albert residents are employed in Edmonton (p. 3)

The expected population increase for the 2016 did not materialize. After reviewing preliminary data from the vendor it was noted that many of the new apartment style dwellings had not been fully occupied at the time of the 2016 municipal census. The reason for the unrealized population increase is not part of the census project, however, it is believed that Alberta's economic downturn over the last few years is a significant factor.

The Census Office achieved a 99% completion rate with residential dwellings in the City.

As well a 50% online census response rate was achieved which is an increase over the 2014 online census response rate of 44%. New communication tools such as roadside signs, direct mail outs, and Facebook advertisements were utilized as new communication tools in 2016.

In 2016 the Census Office initiated a “homeless” census population count at the request of a homeless resident. The Census Office appreciates the effort and support provided by the Community and Social Development Department in this regard. Both the Legislative Services Department and the Community and Social Development Department wish to enhance this aspect of the census in 2018.

Further, the Census Office enhanced the Quality Assurance resourcing for the 2016 census by hiring a specific person for this purpose. The Census Office was pleased

with the results of this initiative and will be reviewing further enhancements to the Quality Assurance program for the 2018 municipal census.

The City's census results were provided to the Minister of Municipal Affairs and we await confirmation of the Minister's acceptance of our census results.

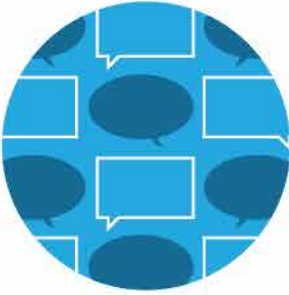
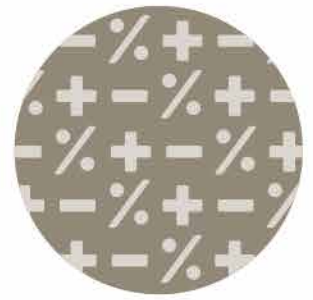
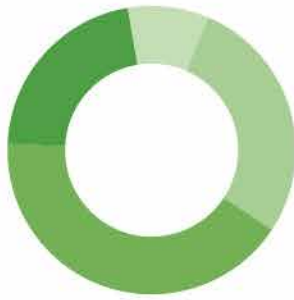

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SUMMARY OF KEY STATISTICS

POPULATION

- St. Albert's population experienced 2.20% growth (1,390 people) over the past two years, increasing to 64,645 from 63,255 in 2014. The average annual growth rate over this period was 1.10%, which is below the 1.85% average annual growth experienced between 2012 and 2014.

AGE GROUPS

- 21.91% of the population is between 50-64 (mature adults), with 20.22% of the population aged 35-49 (adults) and 20.20% aged 5-19 (school age).
- The most populous age category was mature adults, aged 50-64, with 13,155 people. The most populous 1-year age cohort: 53, average age: 40.12.
- The most populous 5-year age cohort was 50 to 54, with 4,594 people (7.65% of total).

NEIGHBOURHOODS

- St. Albert's most populated neighbourhoods are Lacombe Park 11.54%, Grandin, 11.52%, and Erin Ridge 9.29% of the total population.
- Since 2014, the neighbourhood with the largest increase was North Ridge with an increase in population of 791 people, followed by Erin Ridge North, with an increase of 785 people.

HOUSING

- The number of occupied dwellings in St. Albert increased from 23,168 in 2014 to 24,055 in 2016, an increase of 3.83% (average annual increase of 1.91%).
- Single Detached Dwellings account for 72.6% of the occupied housing total, Duplexes 4.2%, Townhouses 9.4% and Apartments 13.7%.
- Most "recent moves" (residency under two years) are from within St. Albert (45.7%), followed by Edmonton (25.8%) and then Alberta (16.2%).

EMPLOYMENT

- Most working St. Albertans are employed in Edmonton (50%), followed by St. Albert (36%), or within 50 km of Edmonton (8%).

LANGUAGES

- Most people reported speaking English primarily (88.4%), followed by French (1.9%), and other languages (5.4%).

Due to varying non-response rates for each census question, some data may not be directly comparable.

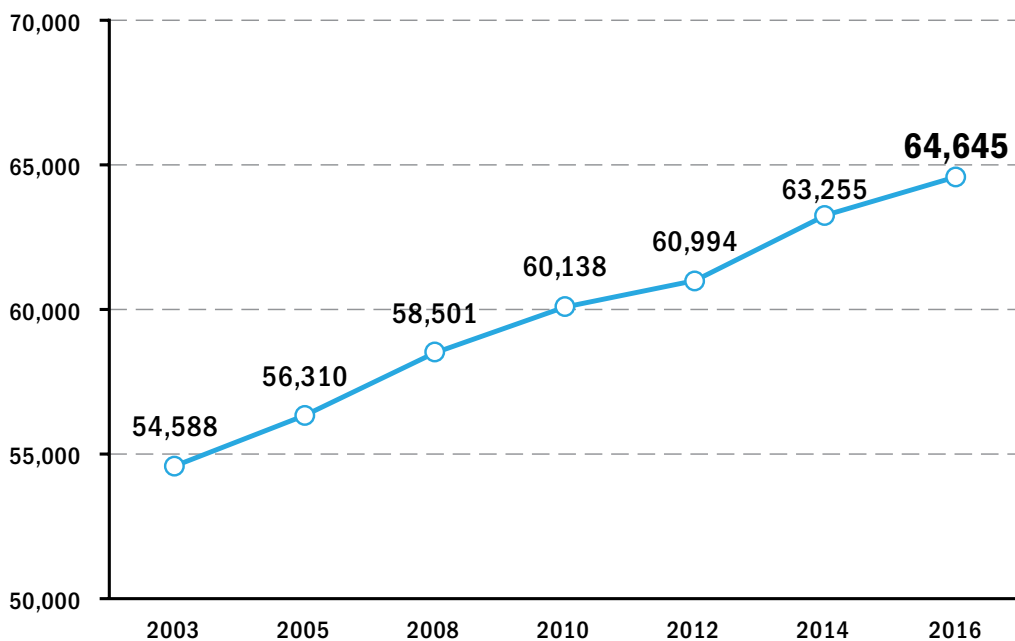

HISTORIC POPULATION GROWTH (MUNICIPAL CENSUS)

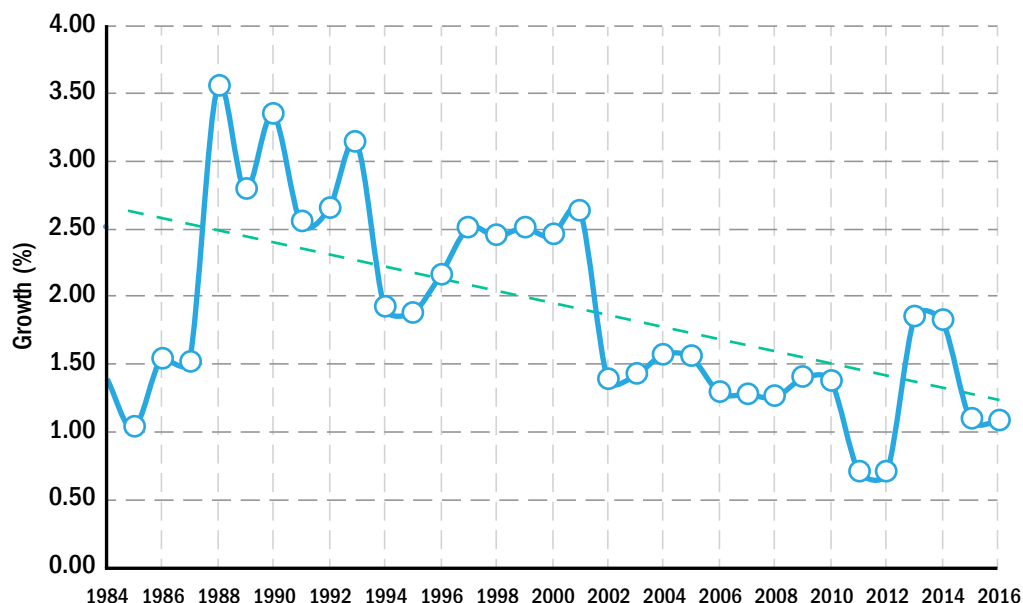

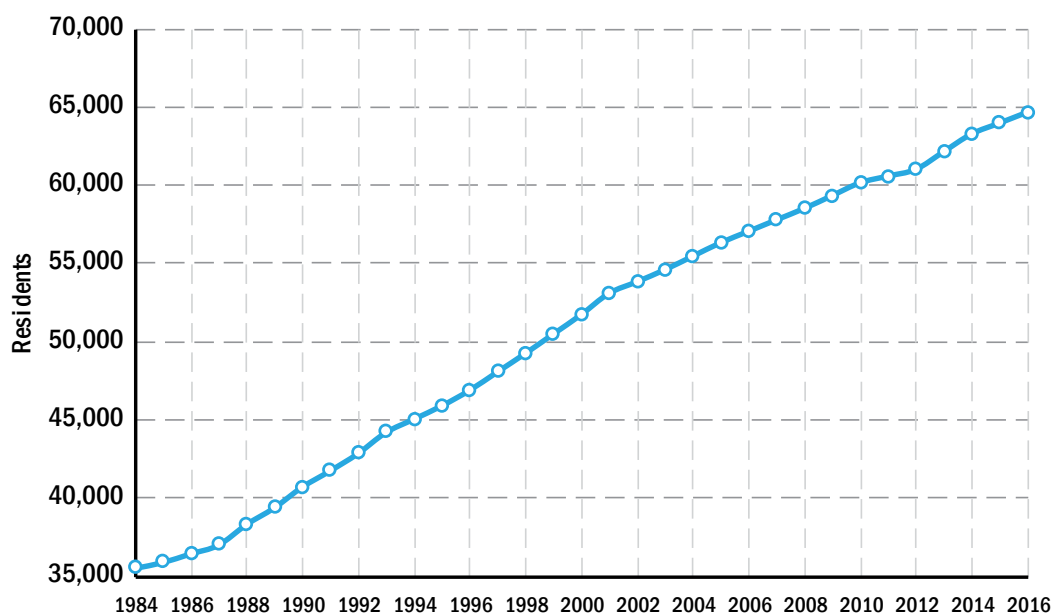
POPULATION GROWTH: TREND ANALYSIS

ST. ALBERT ANNUAL PERCENTAGE POPULATION GROWTH (1984-2016)



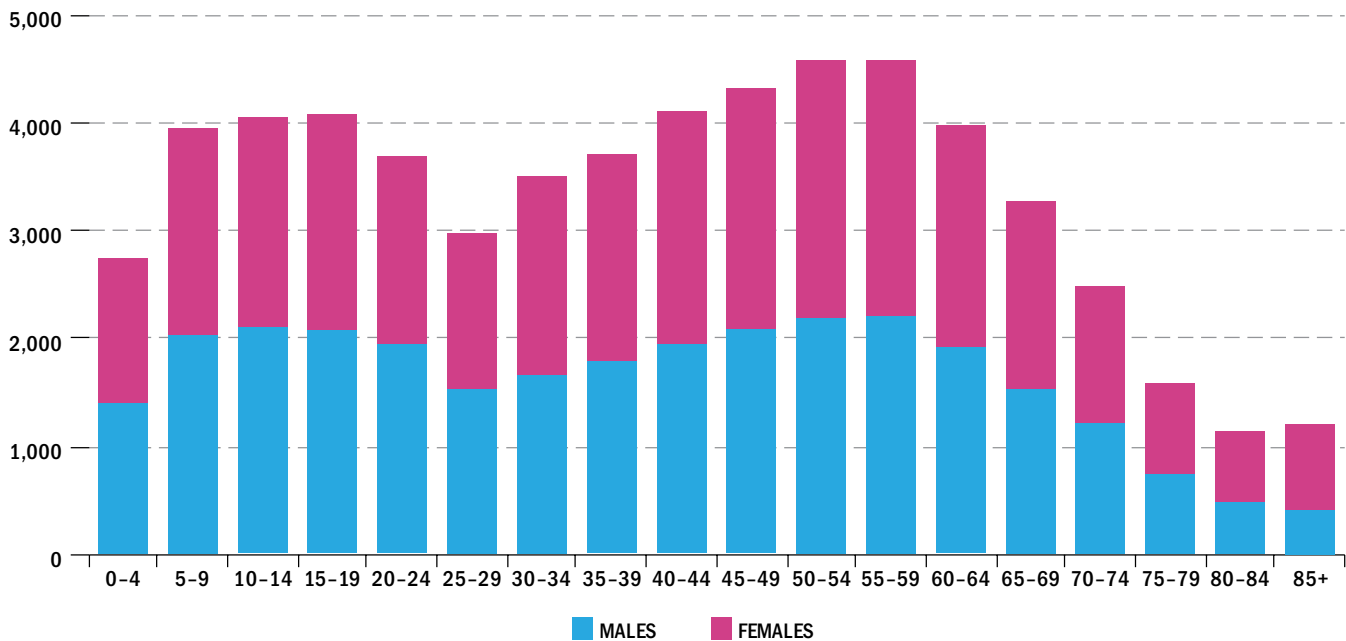
While St. Albert grows steadily at a rate of between 1.0% and 3.0% most years, the general trend over the last 30 years has been towards a slowing growth rate.

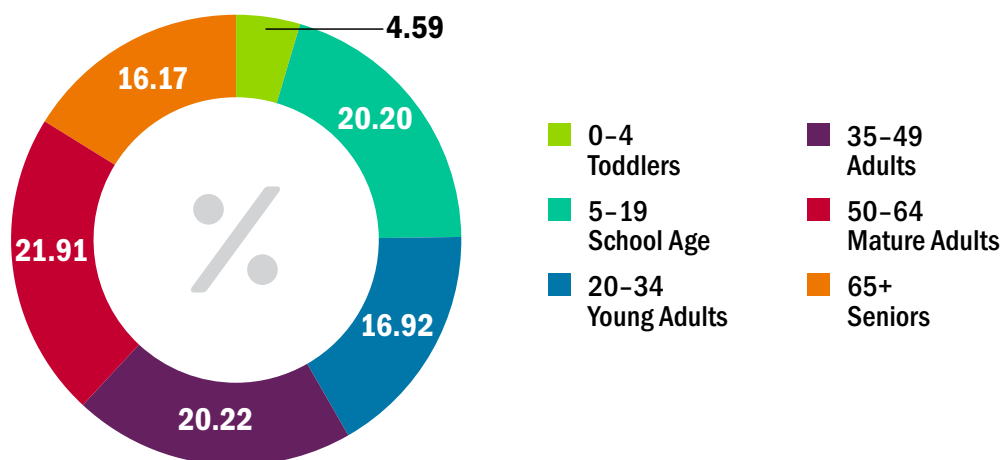

2016 AGE BREAKDOWN



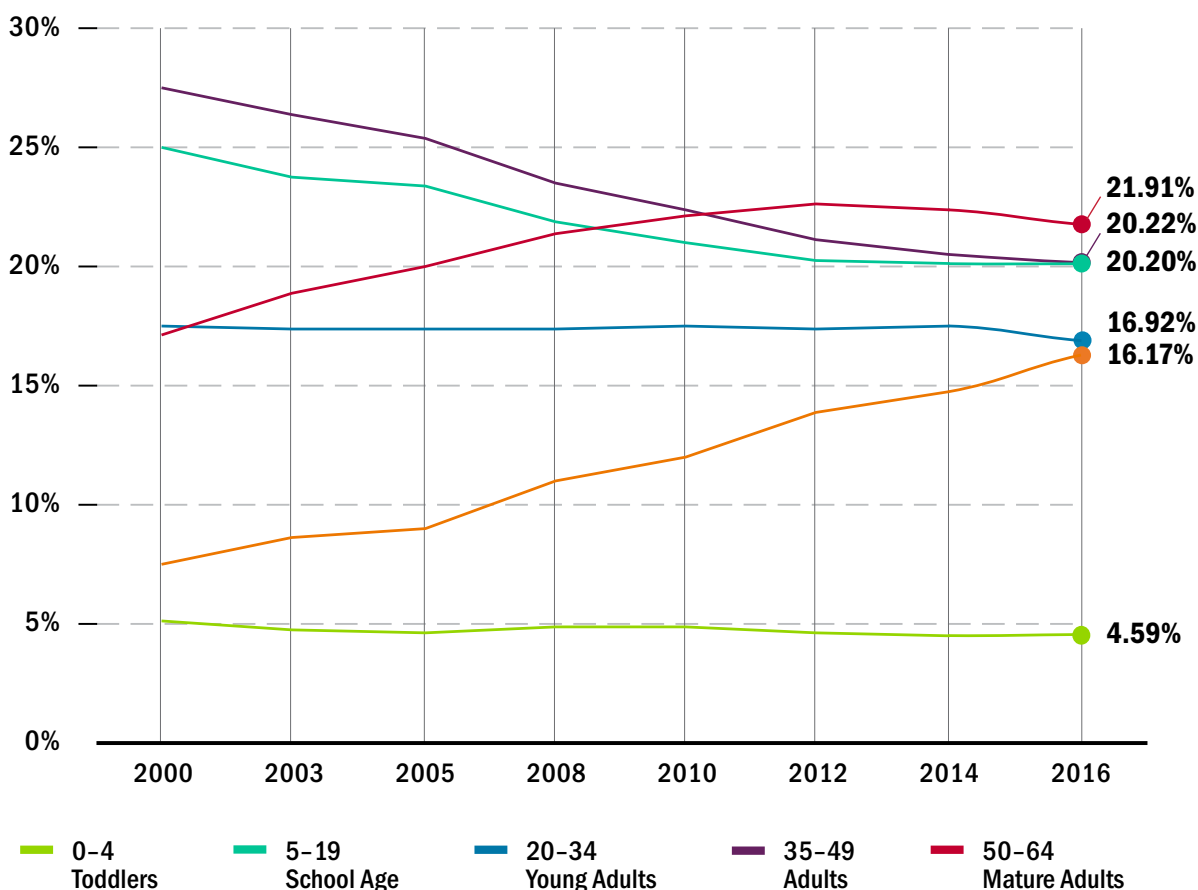

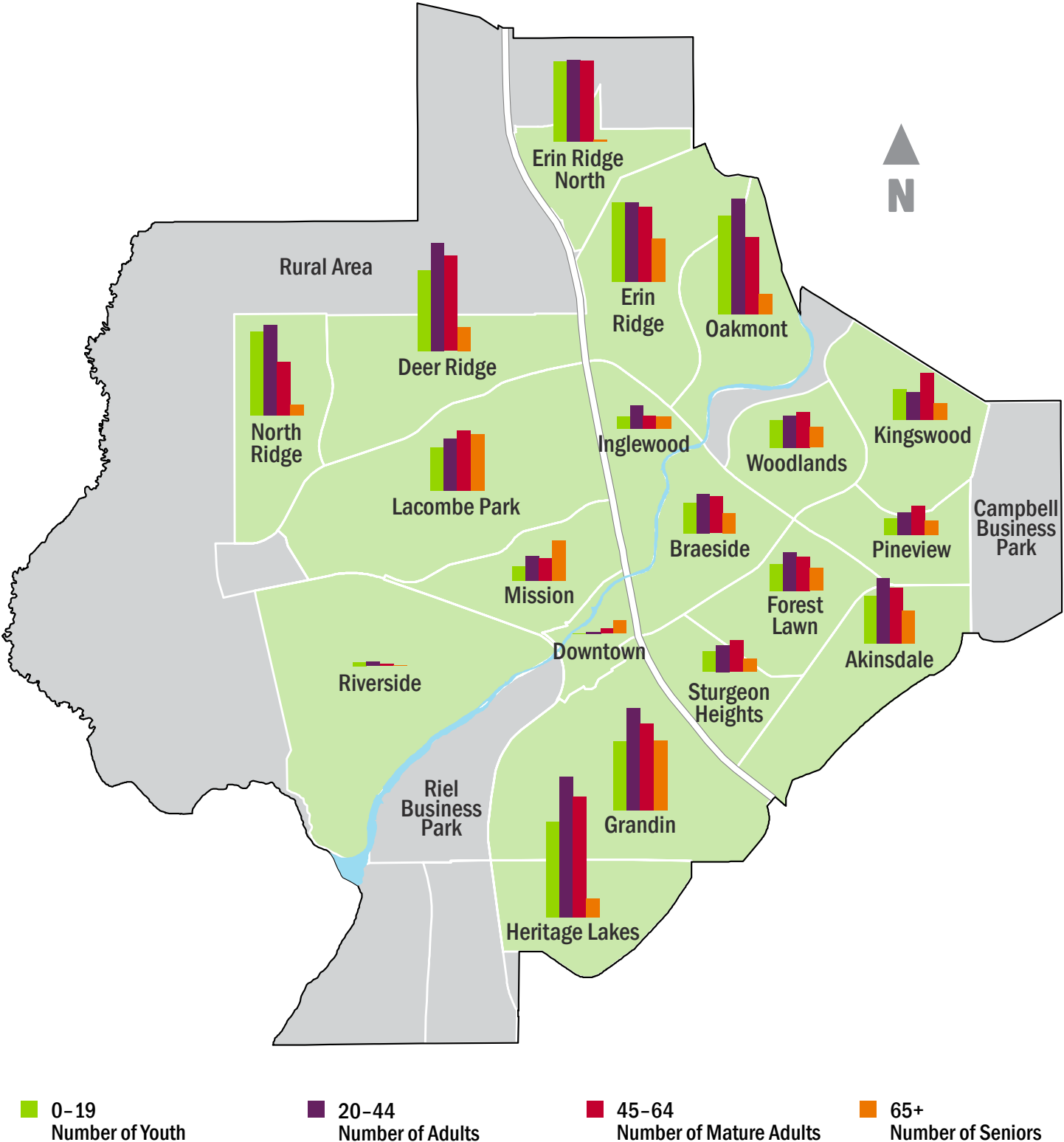

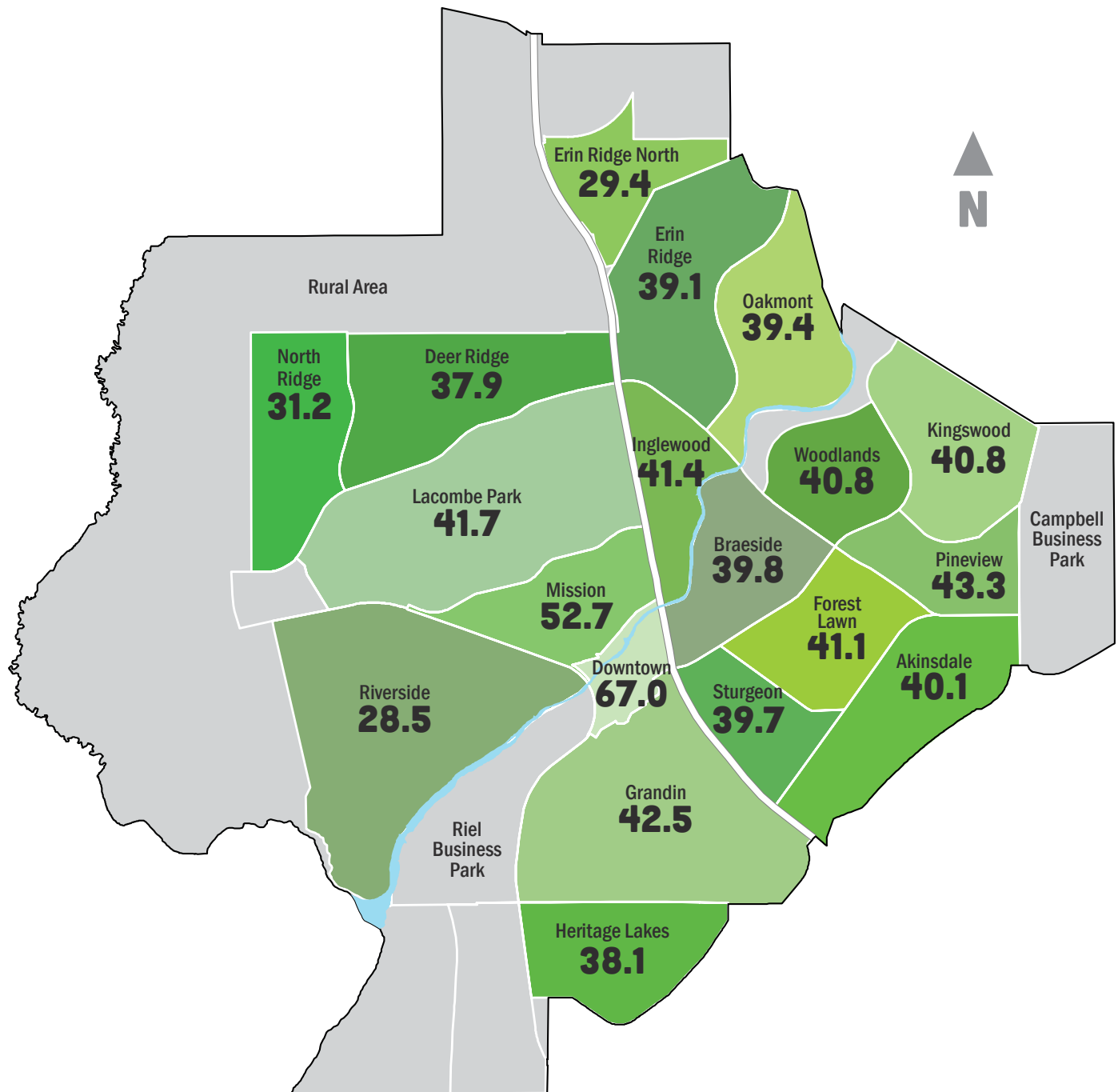
AGE COMPOSITION BY NEIGHBOURHOOD (CONTINUED)

AVERAGE AGE BY NEIGHBOURHOOD



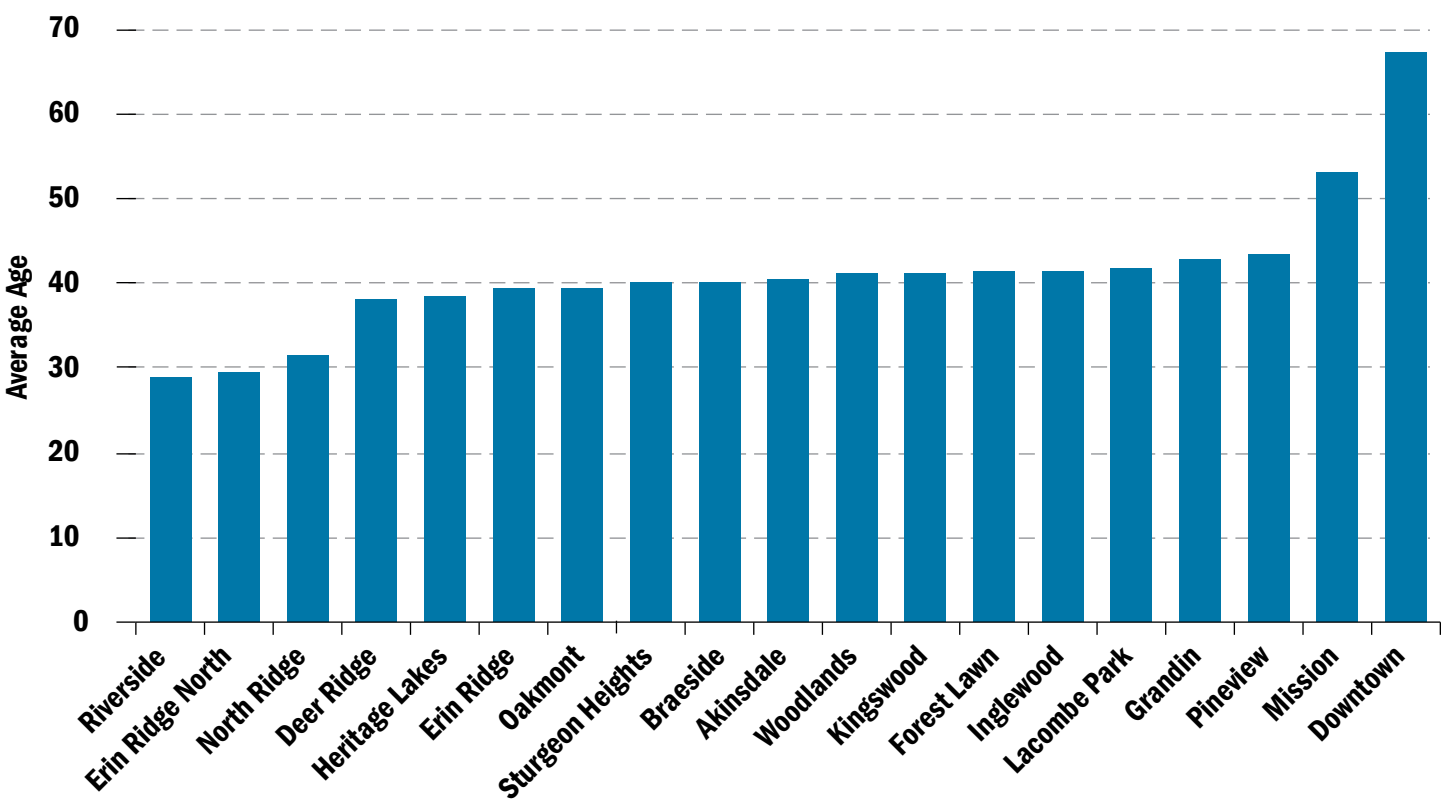
QUICK FACTS

St. Albert’s neighborhoods’ average age, sorted from lowest to highest, reveals that the newer neighbourhoods tend to have younger residents than the older neighbourhoods. It also shows that the vast majority of neighbourhoods have an average age between 35 and 45, with only a few neighbourhoods significantly younger or older than average.

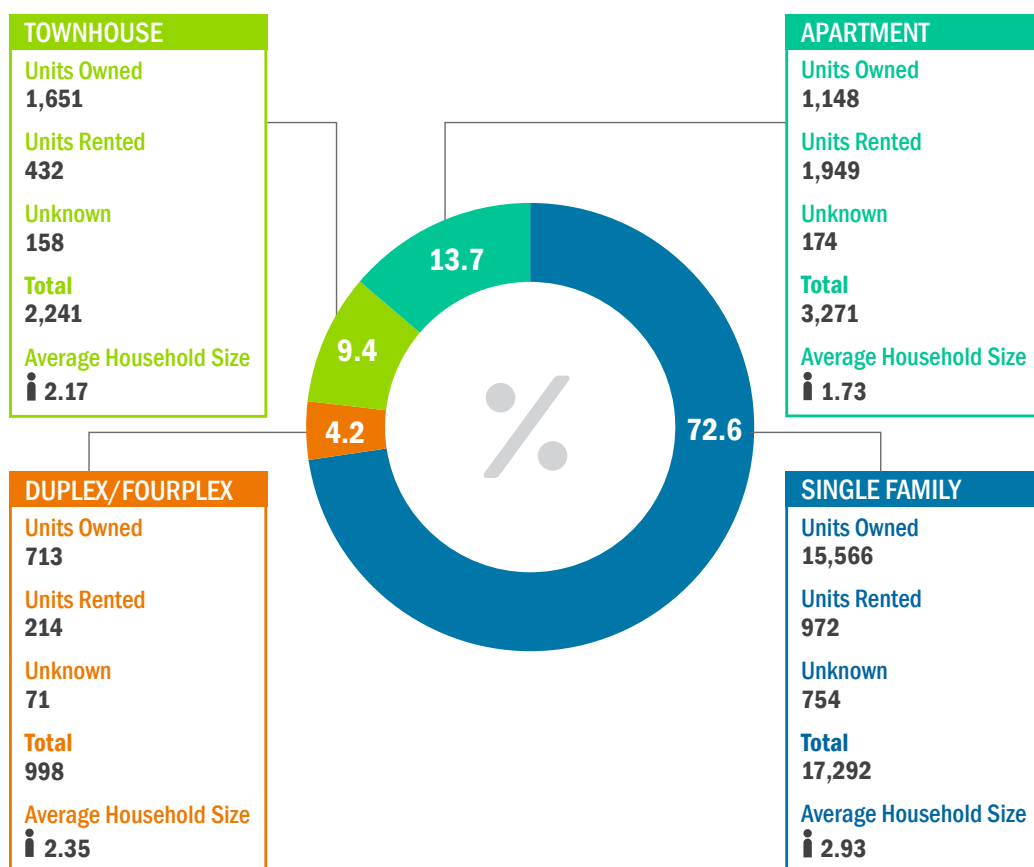

DWELLING TYPE BREAKDOWN



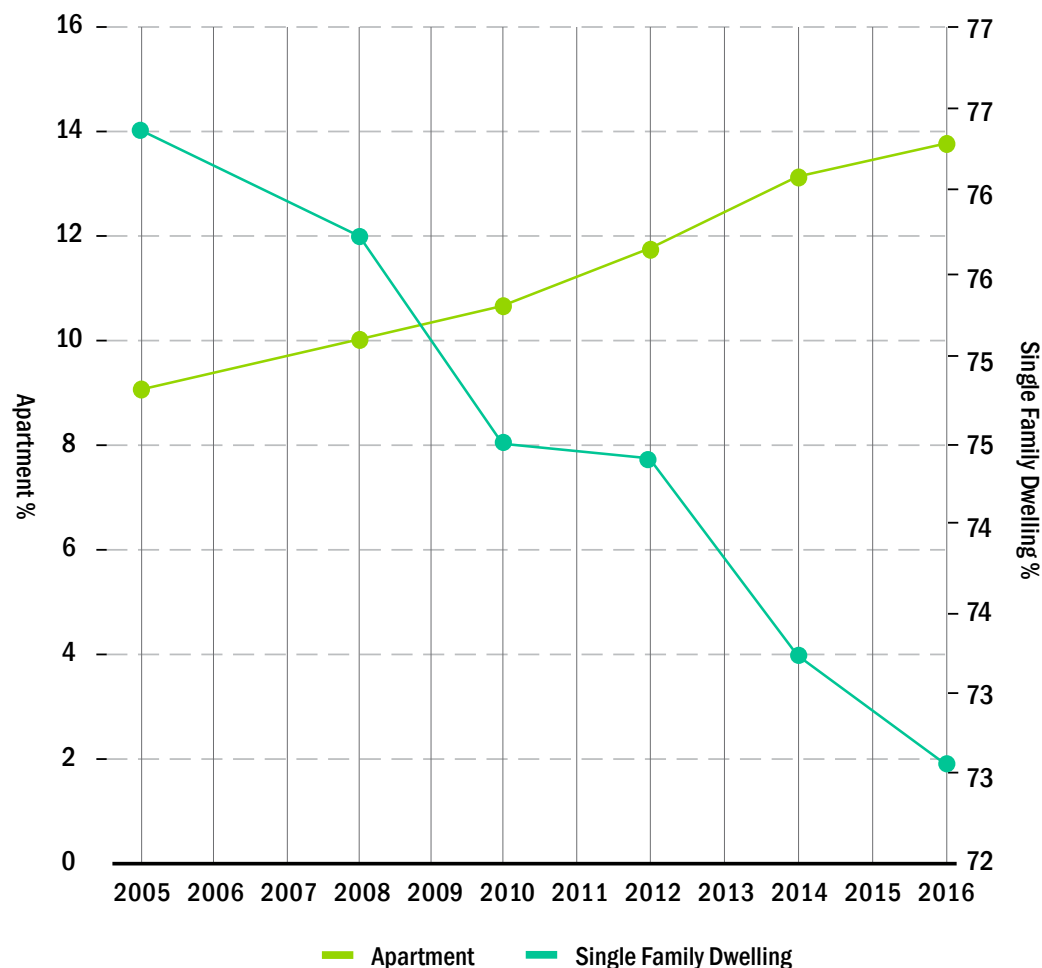

Over the last 13 years, the percentage of Apartments as a ratio of total occupied dwellings in St. Albert has increased from 9.2% in 2003 to 13.7% in 2016. The percentage of Single Family Dwellings has decreased from 76.4% in 2003 to 72.6% in 2016. This shows a trend towards increasing housing density in St. Albert.

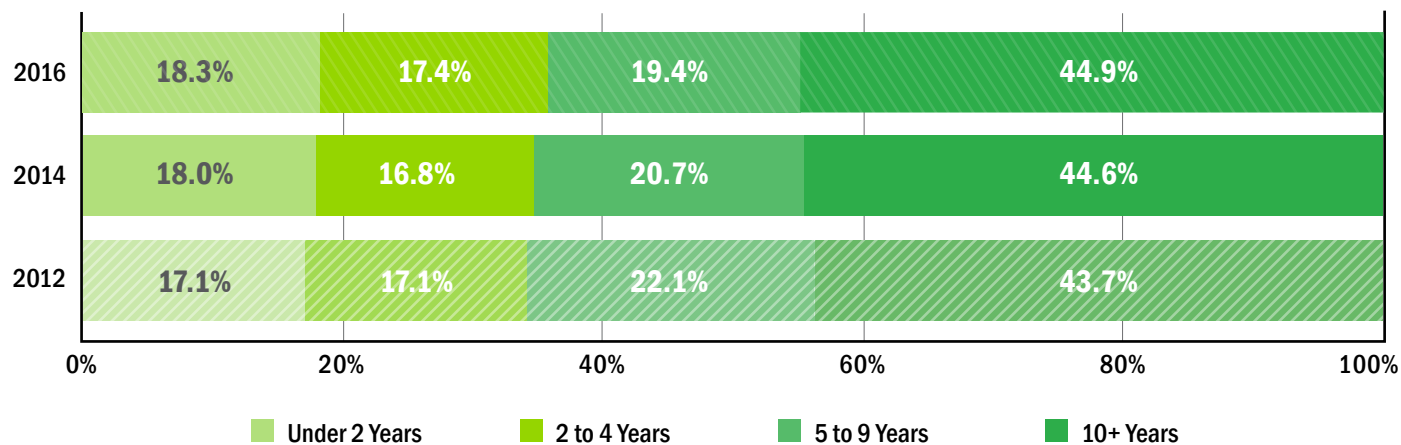

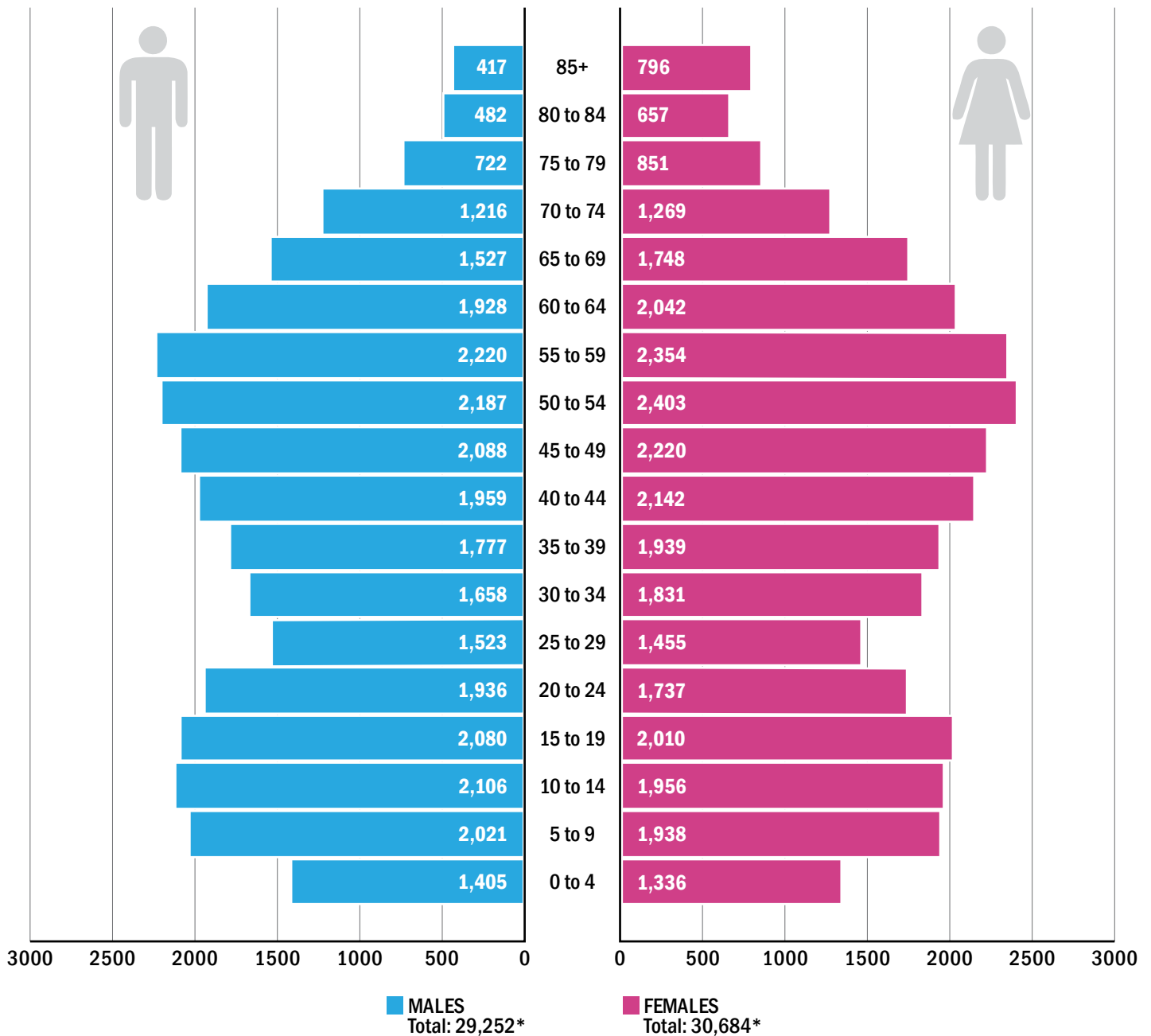

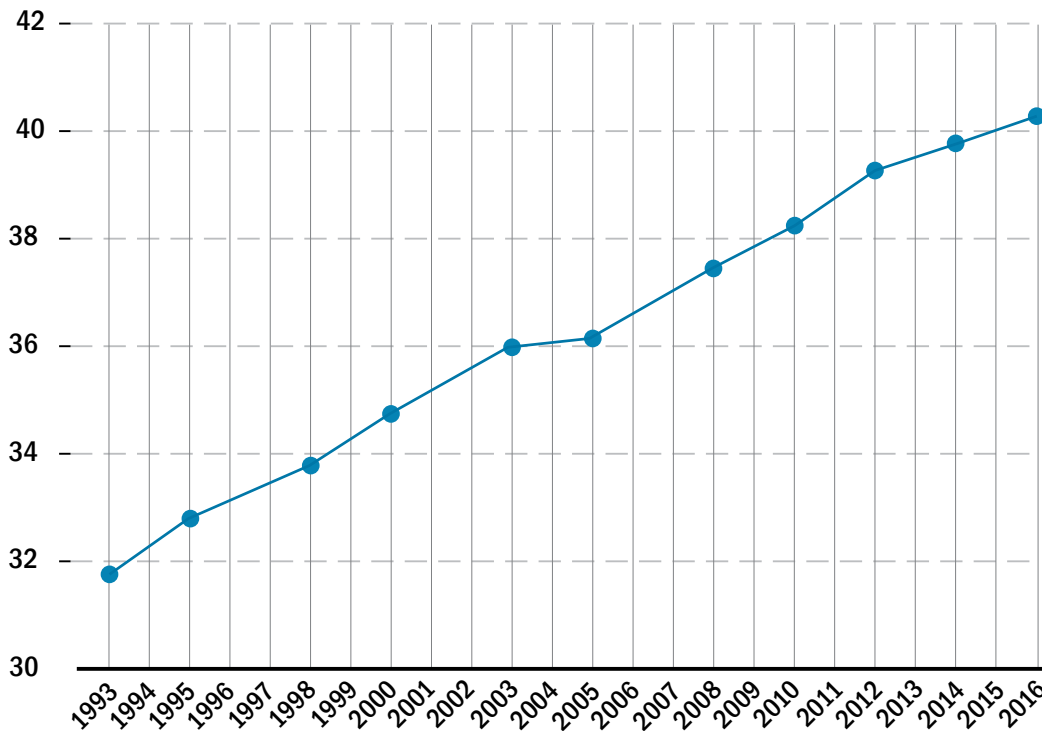

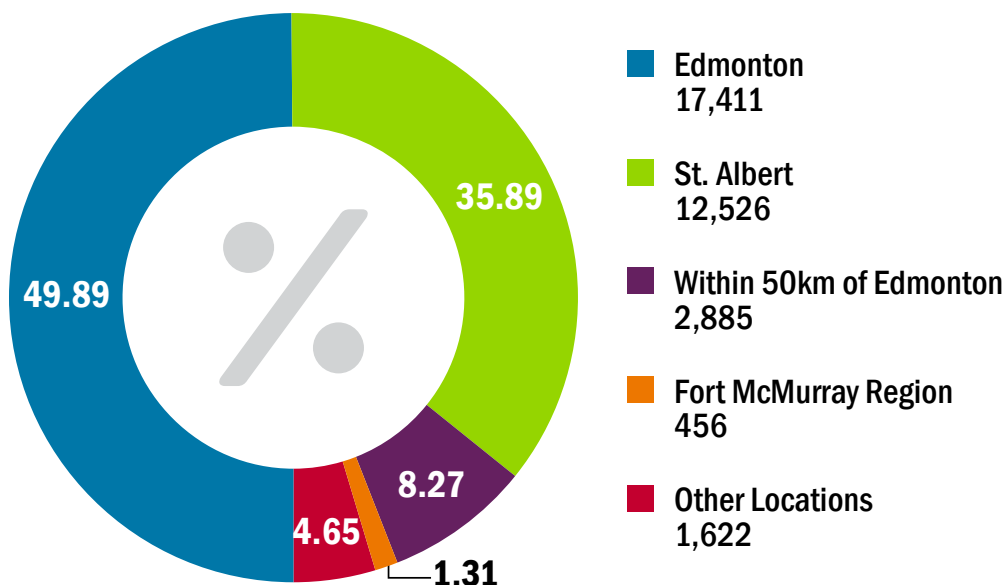

ST. ALBERT RESIDENTS' LOCATIONS OF WORK

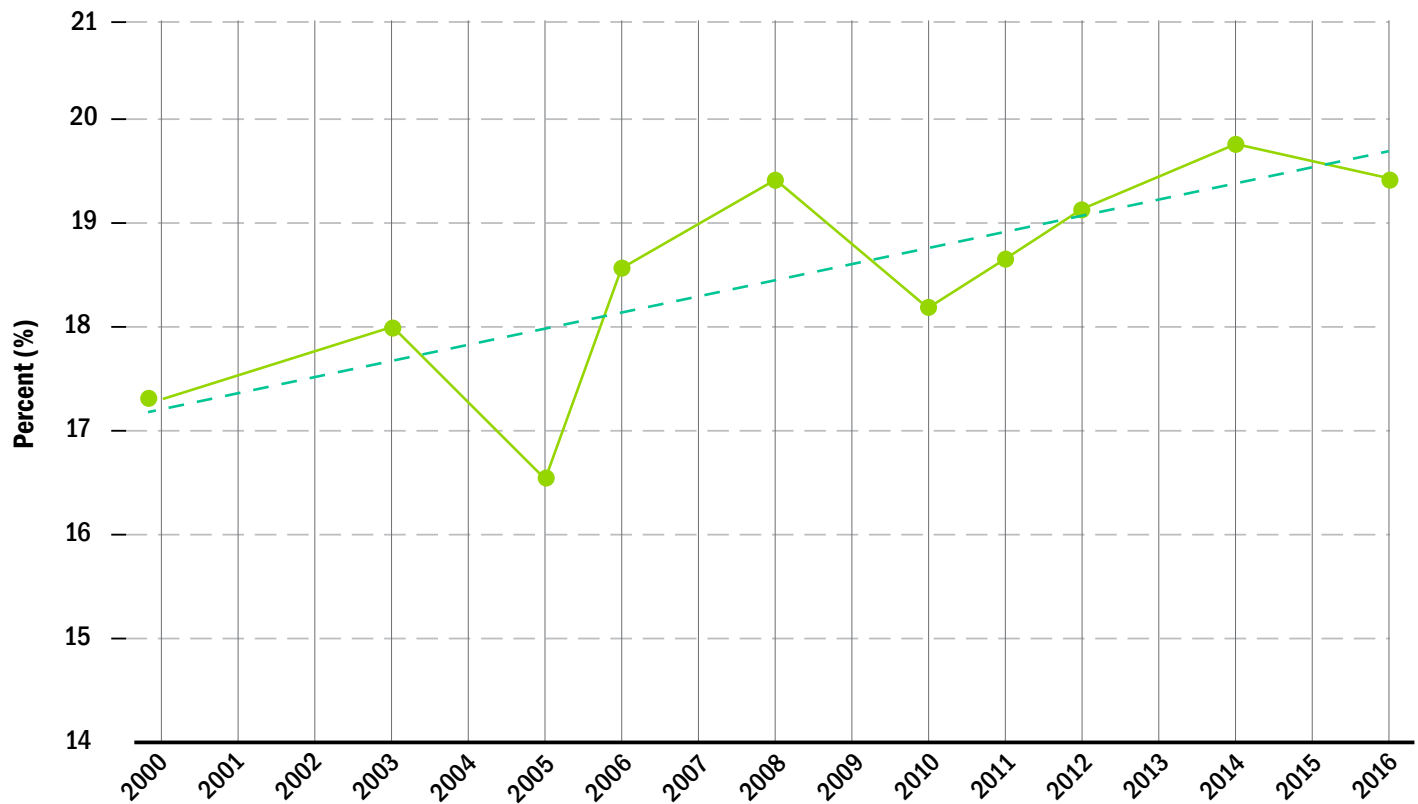


QUICK FACTS

METHODOLOGY

The 2016 Census provided residents with a choice in completing their census online or in person. In 2016, 50% of households completed the census online, compared to 44% completion online in 2014 and 43% online completion in 2012.

The first phase of the census (online enumeration) opened on March 8, 2016 and concluded March 28, 2016. The second phase of the census (traditional door-to-door enumeration) opened on April 6, 2016 and concluded on May 1, 2016. The census project was completed on time with a maximum completion of over 99%.

Census data is subject to a comprehensive audit process, including a detailed logic testing system and a robust error-checking process. In addition, we undertook additional quality assurance testing (as per Municipal Affairs mandatory requirements) to ensure the accuracy of the population count for the City. A random telephone poll of City residents was conducted to ensure the quality of the data collected during the door-to-door campaign, which met the requirements stated in the Municipal Affairs Census Manual.

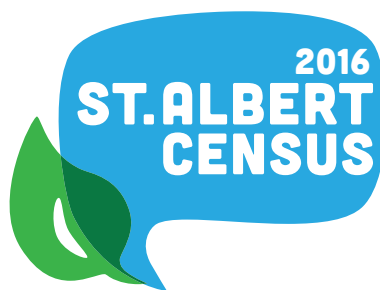
