### **COMMITTEE DIRECTION**

On December 10, 2018 the Governance, Priorities, and Finance Committee (GPFC) made several recommendations to Council in relation to allowing backyard hen keeping as urban agriculture in St. Albert. Most of those recommendations are dealt with in another report on the Council Agenda for January 7, 2019. The one GPFC recommendation relevant to this report is:

*That Bylaw 37/2018, being amendment 163 to the Land Use Bylaw 9/2005, be read a first time on January 7, 2019*

Since Land Use Bylaw amendments require a public hearing, a recommendation to set a public

hearing date has also been included in this report.

## **BACKGROUND AND DISCUSSION**
