RECOMMENDATION(S)

That Council further delay the implementation of extended Handibus hours associated with the approved motion - PM-20-056 moved by Councilor Brodhead. "That the Public Works & Transit Weekday Evening Local Handibus Service business case be funded for \$57,500 within the 2020 operating budget.", and further that transit administration be authorized to implement the extended hours service when demand increases and is sustained at pre-Covid levels.

PURPOSE OF REPORT

To inform Council of the significantly reduced utilization of Handibus services, due to the current pandemic, making extended hours unnecessary due to absence of demand. To provide assurance to Council that with the additional monies previously approved administration can implement when demand increases sufficiently in the future.
